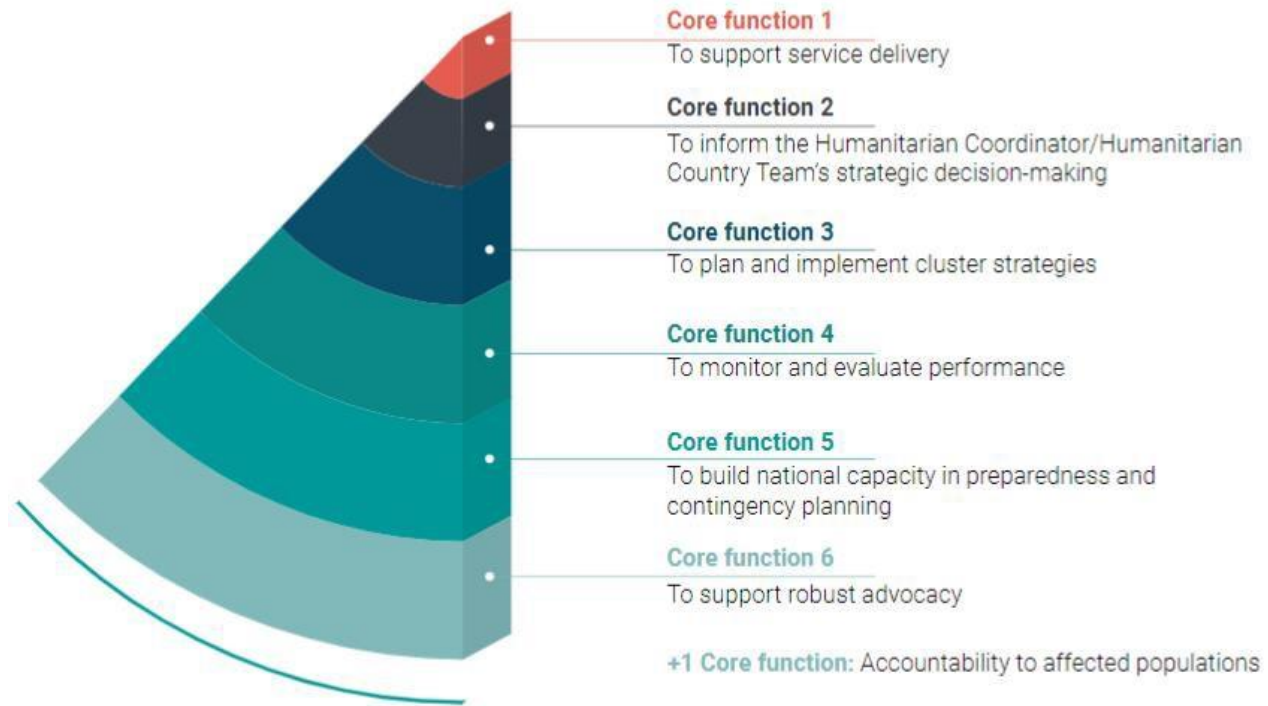

## HRP Countries, Needs, Targets, Results and Funding from Jan to July 2024

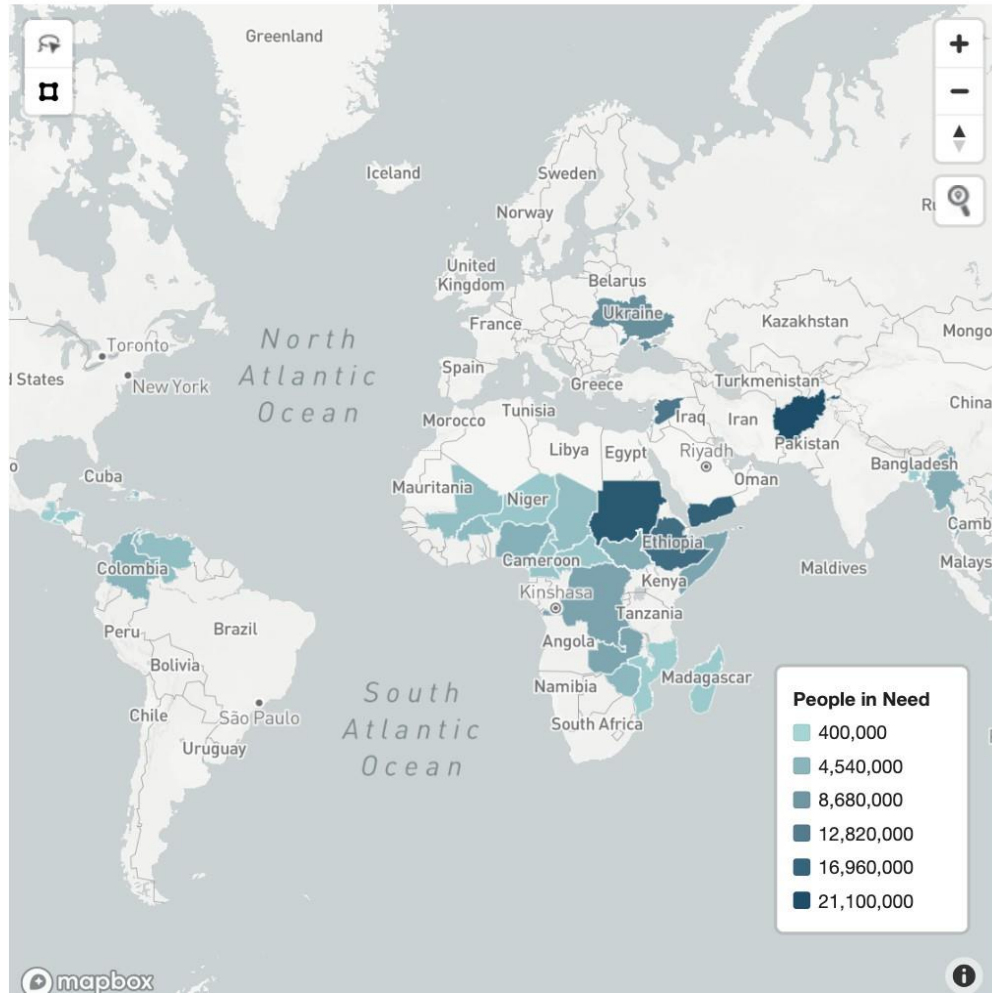
