Context / Background


- + Many useful platforms, tools, resources exist but:
 - + Fragmented, hard to find, and difficult to assess for quality and relevance
 - + Difficult for new/local staff to orient themselves
 - + Information only available in few languages
 - Many high quality resources hidden on individual expert laptops and internal agency databases
- Sanitation/FSM highly contextual where specific expert advice is required




What is the Hub offering?


- + Coordinated global sector go-to-point for sanitation and FSM practitioners that provides orientation and structured access to curated knowledge, resources, events, trainings and existing external platforms and tools
- + Personal remote support for humanitarian WASH practitioners and clusters via a helpdesk, CoP and team of experts
- + Supports collaboration, increased resource efficiency and quality of work through a sector-wide approach on knowledge management
- Basis for a wider WASH HUB (Roadmap Initiative 1)

Coordination with WASH Stakeholders

- → FSM TWiG of the GWC transitioned into SANIHUB Community
- + Collaboration with national WASH clusters (e.g. CXB, LBN, Gaza foreseen)
- + Regular webinars, learning events (incl. livestream from this event), and LinkedIn community
- Collaboration with WASH Roadmap and the WASH Hub initiative







WASH Sector Strengthening & Innovation

- + Transitioning to WASH Hub (WRM Initiative 1): SANIHUB considered the starting point / blueprint for WASH Hub
- + Feasibility study on integrating generative AI both upstream (support collecting, curating) and downstream (UX design)
- + Al powered multilingual support and data driven insights (understanding capacity gaps buy analyzing user questions)
- + New dissemination strategy to reach the last mile
- Expanding current innovation entry point to marketplace for new technologies
